2019 Program: Thinking Out of the Black Box: Exploring New Insights Into North Korea

I. COURSE DESCRIPTION

Professor: John Park, Harvard University

A. Abstract of the Course

This undergraduate course aims to hone students' critical thinking skills by exploring new insights into North Korea through the lens of recent interviews with defectors and by assessing the contemporary media coverage of North Korean defectors. It focuses on three aspects including: the deepening ties between the Worker's Party of Korea and the Communist Party of China; the increasing commercialization in the elite regime circle (the 1%) through state trading company activities and among the masses (the 99%) through black markets, and; how financial sanctions actually bolster North Korean procurement networks.
