## Academic Framework:

- ✓ **Language of Instruction:** All courses are conducted entirely in English.
- ✓ **Credit System:** 1 credit = 8 × 90-minute sessions (12 classroom hours).
- ✓ **Grading System:** Grades are awarded on a scale from A (4.00) to F (0.00).
- ✓ **Cross-Registration System:** Students are free to take courses from both the Graduate School of International Relations (GSIR) and Graduate School of International Management (GSIM).
- ✓ **Course Offerings in GSIR:** A wide range of courses is available in **public policy, economics, politics, law, research methods, regional studies and related fields.**  
**Japanese Language Courses:** Variable credits are awarded according to proficiency level, with courses offered from beginner to advanced.

## Housing and Internet Connection:

IUJ guarantees on-campus housing for all exchange students in one of its three dormitories (SD1–3), each just a short walk from classrooms and campus facilities. Every room is fully equipped with free high-speed internet (wired and wireless), creating a convenient and supportive living environment from the very first day.

## Estimated Monthly Living Expenses:

- Dormitory fee: Up to JPY 39,000/month  
\*10,000 JPY of a maintenance fee at check-in
- Meals: JPY 30,000–40,000/month
- Books: JPY 10,000 - /term
- Miscellaneous: JPY 30,000/month -

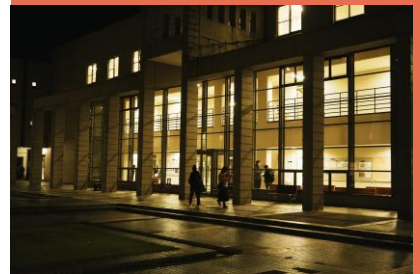
## Visa Support:

To support your entry to Japan, IUJ will apply for your **Certificate of Eligibility (CoE)** on your behalf and send it to you upon issuance. With this document, you can apply for a **student visa** at the Japanese embassy or consulate in your country. Full visa assistance is provided throughout the process.

## Health Insurance:

Enrollment in Japan's National Health Insurance (NHI) is mandatory for those who obtain a Student Visa. With NHI, students pay only **30% of medical costs** at clinics or hospitals. The premium is about 5,000 yen per term. NHI does not cover car accident injuries, so students are strongly advised to obtain additional travel insurance before arrival.
